- 5 日本の高校に通うケンが、オーストラリアにあるコアラホスピタルで働く Ace さん にオンライン上でインタビューをしています。英文を読んで、後の問いに答えなさ い。
- Ken : Thank you for your time, Ms. Ace. I'm really interested in your job and Australian animals.
- Ms. Ace: You are welcome.
- Ken : First of all, could you tell me about your job at the Koala Hospital?
- Ms. Ace: Sure. Our hospital is in New South Wales, a state in southeastern Australia. We have large forests, and \*wild koalas live there. At our hospital, we do "6R's." The first "R" is "Rescue." Every year, we save about 250 koalas. We save koalas hit by cars, or attacked by dogs. We also treat sick koalas. Last year, we had a lot of koalas burnt in \*bushfires. Our professional team gave them medical treatment. The second "R" is "Rehabilitate." After the treatment, we look after them until they are ready to go back to the forest. The third "R" is "Restore." Koalas have fewer and fewer food trees now. So we grow food trees at the hospital for sick or injured koalas to eat. We are hoping to plant trees in wild forests too.
- Ken : Do you return them back to the wild?
- Ms. Ace: Yes. "Release" is the forth "R." We want them to live as wild animals again. We find where they are from, and take them to their home. They don't feel comfortable in new areas. When they are left in a new place, they move around and try to find their familiar trees. ①<u>That</u> increases the risk of getting injured again or dying.
- Ken : I'm sad to hear that. [ A
- Ms. Ace: The fifth one is "Research." We research koala health and food tree health. Also, we are starting the world's first koala \*breeding program. We expect baby koalas to be born in our hospital. We hope to increase the number of koalas. This is the last one, "Repopulate."
- Ken : I see. I saw the news of the big bushfire from 2019 to 2020.
  - В
- Ms. Ace: Me too. Koalas are not good at running away from fire, and during bushfire seasons, we often have more koalas to save. However, last year's bushfires were much bigger than usual. It is said that bushfires usually burn only about 1% of Australian forests. But last year, we lost 21%. According to \*the WWF, the fires burnt about 120,000 km<sup>2</sup> of land.

- Ken : Japan's mainland is about 228,000 km<sup>2</sup>..., so it means an area about half the size of Japan was burnt! I can't believe ②it. I'm sure many koalas have lost their homes.
- Ms. Ace: Because of \*deforestation by humans, koalas' home trees have been lost. The fire made this situation ( ③ ). Koalas cannot survive without help. It is said that koalas could die out in our state as early as 2050.

- Ms. Ace: There is one thing that you may be interested in: adopt a koala.
- Ken : Adopt?
- Ms. Ace: "Adopt" means to welcome someone or something as a part of your family. But adopting a koala doesn't actually mean getting a pet koala at home. It is a project to save koalas. You pay money that goes to the care of a koala in Australia. Your money is also used to help other koalas, plant new trees, and make educational materials to increase public attention to save koalas. \*In return, you get a \*certificate and information such as the name and photos of the koala that you adopt.

For many Japanese people, Brazil is the country of soccer, samba and carnival. It is very far from Japan, and we don't know much about it. But in fact, Japan and Brazil are very closely related. A lot of people from other countries have moved there to work and live. They are called "①<u>immigrants</u>." In the early 20th century, about 5 million immigrants came to Brazil from Europe, \*the Middle East, and Asia. The first Japanese immigrants arrived in Brazil in 1908. Since then, about 260,000 Japanese have come to Brazil.

So, why did so many Japanese move to Brazil? In the early 1900s, Brazil needed more people to grow coffee, and the Brazilian \*government found that Japanese people would come. There was not much work or land for many farmers in Japan then. Therefore, ②[Brazil / order / work / they / came to / in / to ] and get more money. By 1940, more than 180,000 Japanese people had arrived. They went to \*the state of São Paulo because many coffee farms were there.

When Japanese people first arrived, they found that the work was very hard but that the \*pay was bad. A lot of Japanese people wanted to go home. However, they could not because they did not have enough money. Though their situation was bad, (3())()()())()() to start their own farms. They grew things like tea, \*soybeans, fruit, vegetables, and rice. Japanese immigrants spoke Japanese and kept their Japanese customs. They even had Japanese newspapers. There were more than 200 Japanese schools. Children learned about Japanese history and culture.


However, when World War II began, things changed and life became worse for Japanese immigrants. During the war, Brazil and Japan were on (④-a) sides. The Brazilian government ordered them to speak \*Portuguese, not Japanese. Their newspapers, schools, and businesses were (⑤). Some had to leave their homes. Thousands left Brazil.

The situation for immigrants from Japan is now ( 4-b ) from eighty years ago. They have worked hard, and have been successful. Brazil is the country with the largest number of Japanese immigrants and their descendants in the world. Recently, the number of immigrants from Brazil to Japan has also been increasing. 


