In Japan, the New Year is very special. People do many traditional things to bring good luck. One popular custom is visiting temples or shrines. It is called “*hatsumode*.” Many Japanese people go there with their families to pray for a happy and healthy year.

Like in Japan, there are other interesting ways to celebrate the New Year around the world.

In Scotland, New Year's Eve is called “Hogmanay,” and people celebrate with fireworks, music, and parties. One of their most important traditions is “First Footing.” It is believed that, after midnight, the person who first steps into your home brings good luck for the year. This person is known as the “first footer,” and usually brings gifts like bread, coins and drinks.

Another country with an interesting New Year's tradition for good luck is Spain. On New Year's Eve, people participate in the tradition of eating twelve grapes at twelve o'clock. This is called “The Twelve Grapes of Luck.” At twelve o'clock, people quickly eat one grape for each sound of the bells from the clock towers around the town. Each grape means good luck for each month of the coming year. If you can eat them all in time, you can spend a year of happiness and success. This tradition is celebrated with family and friends, often while watching the clock tower in Madrid on TV. Like in Japan and Scotland, the people of Spain hope to start the New Year with good luck through this interesting custom.

“The time of global warming has ended; the time of global boiling has arrived.” This is what \*António Guterres said in New York on July 27, 2023. “It is still possible to keep the \*average global temperature increase below 1.5°C and stop the very worst of global warming. But only ( ① ) big, quick action.” Guterres told reporters.

Now humans and animals face a lot of problems because of global warming. This is clear in \*Antarctica. The area is heating up faster than other parts of the world. Since 1950, it has warmed almost 3°C, higher than the global average. Due to rising temperatures, the ice in Antarctica is \*melting very quickly. The ice supports wild animals like penguins, whales, sea lions and so on. ( ② ) penguins are probably not going to disappear in the next few years, scientists are worried about the big changes that are happening to them. In some areas, their numbers have decreased more than 75% over the last half century.

Ice loss in Antarctica \*has influenced penguins in many ways. First, penguins are losing their homes and trying to find better sea ice. Many penguins live and \*breed on the ice of Antarctica. Because of the melting ice, penguins are moving to safer places to breed. Researchers ③[ go / to / where / photos from / watch / they / space / use ]. New pictures show some penguins are found in places which they have not lived in before. However, it is very difficult for other penguins to find good places to breed because so much ice has gone.

Also, penguins can't get enough food. \*Krill are the main food for penguins. However, research shows that krill numbers have dropped about 80% since the 1970s. Krill mainly eat \*algae. The rise in temperature in Antarctica has caused a big loss of sea ice. Therefore, in order to find the algae that are under sea ice, krill are moving to colder places, far from penguins. Because penguins mainly eat krill, this has resulted in ( ④ ) penguins.

In addition, if the ice melts too early, baby penguins will die because they are not ready to swim yet and the sea is too cold for them to survive. Penguins have waterproof feathers to keep them dry and warm while they are in the cold sea. However, baby penguins need time to grow their waterproof feathers. Since the ice is melting very fast, they have to go into the sea before they grow these. According to scientists, about 10,000 baby penguins died in 2022 because of ⑤this problem.

Penguins are important for showing how healthy the seas are. They are very

sensitive to changes in the environment. Research shows more than 90% of \*emperor penguins will be gone by the end of this century if the speed of today's warming continues. Penguins are only one of the examples that show us the negative results of global warming. The signs of global warming are everywhere, and are more than just rising temperatures. Nobody wants to “boil the earth.” There is no time left. Each of us must act now to deal with global warming.

Ryo: Yes, that’s right. Shibusawa Eiichi was chosen for one of the new notes.

Aya: Why was he chosen?

Ryo: Because he is famous for achieving many great things.

Aya: I know his name, but I don’t really know what he did. Can you tell me more?

Ryo: Sure. He was a very important businessperson and helped to \*modernize Japan’s \*economy during the Meiji period.

Aya: Oh really? I didn’t know that.

Ryo: In 1873, he opened the first bank in Japan. Now, it’s known as Mizuho Bank. At first, people didn’t understand how banks worked, so few people put money into them. But he believed that they were necessary to improve Japan’s economy. ( ① ), people accepted his idea.

Aya: Sounds like he changed people’s minds. [ A ]

Ryo: About one year after the bank started, the Ono family \*went bankrupt. It was one of the most important business groups which supported him when he started the bank. Since it lost the family’s support, the bank didn’t have enough money and nearly had to shut down.

Ryo: Although he faced many problems, he never gave up. And because of him, there are many banks in Japan now. Also, he built railways too. When he went to

Europe, he saw railways for the first time in France. He was surprised that trains could carry a lot of goods and people at the same time. He was sure they were necessary for the future of Japan.

Aya: I see. Look! Tokyo Station is printed on the other side of the 10,000 yen note. [ B ]
